High school life: Cosmetics recipe



During our cosmetics workshop, we discovered what really hides inside a face cream — and how science and care blend together.

Between chemistry, precision, and creativity, we created a smooth and natural-textured cream — enough to feel like we were in a real lab.

Step by Step

MIXING SCIENCE AND CARE

Step 1 — Measuring
It all started with carefully
measuring each ingredient to
ensure precision.

Step 2 — Preparing the phases We separated the formula into the water phase and the oil phase.







Step 3 — Heating Both phases were heated to 65– 70°C.

Step 4 — Emulsifying
We then mixed and emulsified both
phases together to create a smooth
and stable cream.

Step 5 — Adding fragrance Once the mixture had cooled down to around 30°C, we added a few drops of fragrance.



Step 6 — Final texture
The cream thickened and turned into a soft, uniform texture.

HERE, IT SMELLS LIKE PEACHES!

Recipe







- 4 eggs
- 80g of sugar
- 420g of mascarpone
- 1 tablespoon of vanilla extract
- speculoos
- a cup of coffee or a small bowl of milk (if you prefer)
- spéculoos spréad

Mix the egg yolks and sugar, then add the mascarpone and vanilla. Finally, gently fold in the beaten egg whites.

Dip the speculoos cookies in coffee or milk, then arrange them in your container. Next, add a layer of cream and repeat several times. Finish with a layer of cream. Refrigerate overnight or for several hours.

Melt some speculoos spread and add it to the tiramisu. Decorate the tiramisu with pieces of speculoos.

Refrigerate for 30 minutes.

THE HISTORY OF THE LOUVRE

At first, the Louvre was not a museum but a royal palace. It was built in the 12th century by King Philip Augustus to protect Paris from invasions.

Over the centuries, it became the residence of French kings, especially under Francis I and Louis XIV, who expanded and decorated it.

But when Louis XIV decided to move to Versailles, the Louvre was abandoned as a royal palace.





THE FIRE AT THE LOUVRE

In 1871, during the Paris Commune, a fire broke out and destroyed part of the palace and several rooms.

Fortunately, the fire didn't destroy everything, and the Louvre was later restored.

It then became a museum, symbolizing French art and culture, home to famous masterpieces like the Mona Lisa and the Venus de Milo.

THE JEWEL THEFT (2025)

But the story of the Louvre still continues...

On October 19, 2025, a spectacular robbery took place in the Apollo Gallery, where the French Crown Jewels are displayed. Thieves disguised as workers used a lift truck to enter through a window and stole several historic jewels, including a diamond tiara and an emerald necklace once owned by Empress Eugénie.

The robbery lasted less than ten minutes.

Some jewels were found damaged, but most are still missing.

A denim bag?

- -2x 50x70 cm of denim fabric (you can also do patchwork)
- -2x 50x70 cm cotton fabric
- ruler
- pins
- -thread and needle (or, for the luckier ones, a sewing machine)

Step 5: Attach Handles to Outer Bag

- Measure 12 cm in from each side seam along the top edge of the denim bag.
- Pin one end of each handle there (on the inside, facing down).
- Make sure the handles aren't twisted.
- Baste (temporarily sew) or pin them in place.

Step 6: Assemble the Bag

- Keep the lining inside out and place the outer denim bag inside it, so right sides are facing each other.
- The handles will be sandwiched between the denim and the lining.
- Match up side seams and pin around the top edge.
- Sew all around the top with a 1.5 cm seam allowance.

Step 7: Turn and Finish

- Pull the bag right side out through the opening in the bottom of the lining.
- Sew the opening in the lining closed (by hand or machine).
- Push the lining inside the denim bag and press the top edge neatly.
- Topstitch around the top edge of the bag (about 0.5 cm from the edge) to give it a professional finish and secure the handles.

DAISYDENIMS

Got old jeans that are too big or stained? Don't throw them away! Make a fashionable and eco-friendly bag!



Step 1: Cut and Prepare Your Fabric

- Trim edges if necessary so all your rectangles are neat and even (50 \times 70 cm each).
- If using patchwork denim, sew small denim scraps together first until you get two 50×70 cm panels. Press the seams flat.

Step 2: Sew the Outer Bag (Denim)

- Place the two denim pieces right sides together (the side you want showing should face inward).
- Pin along the two long sides and the bottom.
- Sew around these three sides with a 1.5 cm seam allowance, leaving the top open.
- · Reinforce the corners by backstitching (sewing a few stitches backward) at the beginning and end.
- Trim corners to reduce bulk, then turn the bag right side out and press it.

Step 3: Create the Lining (Cotton)

- Place the two cotton pieces right sides together.
- Pin and sew along both long sides and the bottom just like the denim — BUT leave a 10 cm opening in the bottom seam (this will be used to turn the bag later).
- Don't turn the lining right side out yet.

Step 4: Make the Handles

You have two options:

Option 1 - Fabric Handles

- Cut two denim or cotton strips, about 8 cm \times 60 cm each.
- Fold each strip in half lengthwise (right sides together) and sew along the long edge.
- Turn them right side out and press flat.
- Topstitch along both edges for a neat look.

Option 2 - Repurpose Handles Use old belt pieces or sturdy cotton webbing instead — cut two lengths of about 60 cm each.
